OBITUARY

The well-known sculptress Ginette Bingguely-Lejeune died at Corseaux early in April. She and her late husband used to live in London, and there are many amongst our readers who will remember-them vividly. Her death occurried shortly before one of her great sculptures, a bust of General Guisan, is to be installed on the Main Square of Avenches. The artist had been awarded the "Grand Prix de sculpture du Salon d'Hiver" in Paris for one of the Guisan busts.

In 1952, she opened a studio above Chardonne, where she created a number of busts of famous men, such as Emperor Haile Selassie, General de Gaulle, Marshall Lord Montgomery and the Nobel Prize Winner René Cassin.

Mrs. Bingguely was originally French. In 1961, she created a Foundation for the Hospital "de la Providence" at Vevey. She was an Officer of the Legion of Honour and a holder of the Gold Medal of the "Société Française des Arts, Sciences et Lettres".

We have just heard that another loyal old subscriber of the "Swiss Observer" has died. Mr. Paul Barras, of "Le Molesori", 27 Shaftesbury Avenue, Preston Road, Harrow, passed away on 1st April. He was born in Fribourg on 12th December 1893, a citizen of Broc/Bulle. Mr. Barras came to this country after the first world war, For 27 years, he was *Chef de Cuisine* at the Liberal Club in London. He leaves a widow to whom we express our sincere sympathy in her bereavement.
