Before closing the Meeting the President explained the present position as regards the Swiss Forum.

Welfare Office for Swiss Girls in Great Britain

The following is an extract from the Annual Report for the Year 1969 as presented at the Annual General Meeting held at the Swiss Hostel for Girls, 9 Belsize Grove, N.W.3 on the 11th May, 1970.

For the last few years the Committee has had no particular problems regarding the activity of the Welfare Office and the year 1969 happily was no exception. Mrs. Kind continued in office. During holiday periods the Swiss Benevolent Society kindly allowed Mrs. Sharp to stand in for Mrs. Kind and Miss Siegrist, the Warden of the Swiss Hostel, was very helpful.

In addition to her manifold duties Mrs. Kind undertook the preparation of the Report "20 Years Welfare Office for Swiss Girls" which was published in English and French/German. 850 copies were distributed. In October a reception to mark the 20th Anniversary was generously offered by H.E. the Swiss Ambassador and Madame Keller at their residence, to which the Presidents of the Swiss Associations with whom we work were invited, as well as persons and representatives of various institutions and bodies who were helpful to the Welfare Office. The members of the Committee were particularly pleased to welcome Frau E. Zünd, President of Pro Filia, Frau E. Steiger, President of the Amies de la Jeune Fille, as well as former Presidents of these two organisations, viz. Frau D. Wyrsh, Frau H. Lutz and Madame Y. Darbre. Among the English guests we were honoured by the presence of Mr. David Ennals, Ministry of Social Security. The Reception was well attended and afforded an opportunity of thanking personally all those who help our Welfare Officer in her daily tasks.

In October Mrs. R. Baumann joined the Committee as representative of the Amies de la Jeune Fille. Towards the end of the year the President, Mrs. M. H. Ellis, announced that she would no longer be able to continue in office after the next Annual General Meeting. Her decision was prompted by the enormous increase in the work at the Ports at local and national level which would result from the setting up of the Immigration Appeals Tribunals at Easter 1970. The importance of Mrs. Ellis's work has been officially recognised and cannot be exaggerated and we are indeed fortunate in having been able to retain her services for so long.
