Such a hotel will survive, and the Osborne certainly will, because there will always be a clientele ready to support this managerial philosophy with its cheque books.

I've also been told by English friends that it is possible to find Birchermuesli at health food stores such as Horsebury's and Prewitt's and at Crank's, the vegetarian restaurant. Birchermuesli must be better established here than I ever dreamt of.
