# DINNER ORGANISED BY THE INSTITUTE OF SWISS TRADE PROMOTION

The problems of communication posed by the postal strike didn't prevent over thirty Swiss and British businessmen from attending a dinner with a speaker organised by the Institute of Swiss Trade Promotion. The dinner took place in the Stanhope Suite of the Dorchester Hotel and was chaired by Mr. R. Suess, Chairman of the Swiss Economic Council. Our speaker was Professor Charles Iffland, of Lausanne University, a specialist on the economics of development. Under the heading of "The developing nations, Switzerland and Europe" he outlined the various popular misconceptions on the problems of underdevelopment and the gross oversimplifications often indulged with in the solutions put forward. Prof. Iffland held a basically liberal outlook and poo-pooed the starry-eyed idealists who, at a convention organised by the reformed churches in Berne last December, squarely proclaimed that Switzerland was exploiting the poorer countries. Prof. Iffland upheld the value of private investments and refused to consider them simply as a means of capitalist "exploitation". Referring to public aid (which is noticeably small in Switzerland) the speaker said that Switzerland could never hope to obtain tangible results by giving a yearly aid worth 20 centimes each beneficiary. The bulk of Switzerland's aid to the third world was aimed at Africa and most of it concentrated in the small country of Ruanda. It was the only way in which this aid could bring about some measurable results. Prof. Iffland said that the aims of private and public aid were basically the same and neither should be spurned at. He propounded no particular faith or philosophy of development. His exposé was limited to a realistic assessment of the subject. It was followed by a discussion.
