"Feeding the Family"

This was the theme of a talk to young Swiss women married and settled in England at the Swiss Church on Wednesday, 19th May. This subject was expertly developed by a lecturer from the flour advisory bureau. It was preceded by a short meditation by Marcel Dietler on "Feeding the soul". Pastor Dietler has been organising for some time these monthly meetings where young mothers (such as former au pair girls married to Englishmen) can meet in a familiar atmosphere, feel at home and bring up their children.

It is a splendid innovation and any young Swiss mothers not normally connected to the Swiss Church who would like to meet their compatriots are strongly welcomed to look up Marcel Dietler on the column to the right and ask for more details.

THE BRITISH SPEAK OF THE SWISS

We have noted two lengthy features on Switzerland in the National Press lately. One appeared in a "Daily Telegraph" colour supplement. It described, with an astonishment understandable on the part of an Englishman, the high degree of preparedness and military strength of two neutral nations, Switzerland and Sweden.

Another article we noted was a feature on the "Part of Switzerland the Swiss like best", (the shores of the Bodensee), which appeared in the "Sunday Express" about six weeks ago. I understand this article caused a flood of enquiries at the Swiss National Tourist Office. We were surprised to see on two occasions a complete page of "La Suisse" devoted to Northern Irish Touristic and Commercial Propaganda. The advertising feature extolled the investment opportunities of his province.
