“THE LONELINESS OF THE LONG-DISTANCE RADIO”

This is the title of a talk which will be given to the London Group of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique on Thursday, 20th January, at 7 p.m. (Swiss Hostel for Girls, 9 Belsize Grove, NW3). The speaker will be Mr. Noël Curchod, Director of the European and Overseas Broadcasting Services of Switzerland (short waves).

After studying in Geneva, Mr. Curchod became a reporter for Radio Lausanne and also worked for Swiss Television and various papers. In 1962, he came to London and spent some time with the BBC French Service. A year later, he was appointed Deputy Director of the Swiss Short Wave Services and became head in 1965. He is also a member of the Commission of the Swiss Abroad and has always taken a great interest in the problems of his compatriots living outside Switzerland. He is coming to London specially to talk to the Nouvelle Société Helvétique.

The subject is one of which we know very little, and the evening will be of great interest to many. All Swiss and their friends are warmly welcome.
