Mr. Sommer was born in Berne and educated at the *Progymnasium*, Burgdorf. After a commercial apprenticeship and obtaining the diploma of the Swiss Mercantile Society, he continued his studies at what was then called the Academy of Commercial Science in Berne, graduating with honours.

Next, Mr. Sommer spent one year in a bank, three years with a manufacturing concern in Italy and two years at Sulzer Bros, in Winterthur.

During the first world war, Mr. Sommer came to London, where he held a responsible position with A. Wander, Ltd. until he retired some years ago. He is a Fellow of the Institute of Company Accountants and of the Faculty of Corporate Secretaries.

If his business career was one of great distinction and success, his activities in the Swiss community are legion. The countless services he rendered the Swiss Church during very difficult years left an indelible mark. As Trustee of the Swiss Mercantile Society he was of great value not only to the society, but also to the many thousands of young compatriots who attend its College.

He also worked untiringly in the field of welfare. He was Chairman of the Swiss Hostel for Girls and President of the Swiss Benevolent Society. Previously, he had been President of the Foyer Suisse and of the Swiss Male Choir

These are just a few bare facts which represent many years of unselfish and devoted work by a man whose loyalty and integrity have always been unquestioned. I know that Fred Sommer's modesty will not altogether like such praise, but as I said on his 75th birthday, such devotion to public service should be held up to others as an example at a time when it becomes more and more difficult to find personalities of his calibre.

And again, I cannot do better than repeat what I wrote in February 1967, that his strong sense of duty has always been helped in his rich life by a great and strong faith in the Almighty. He has been fortunate in having a loving wife at his side, and we join her, their family and large numbers of friends here and in Switzerland in wishing him many happy returns of the day and God's rich blessings in the future.

Dr. A. Weitnauer paid an official visit to the Swiss Mercantile Society's College of English at Fitzroy Square on Wednesday afternoon, 2nd February. Having been welcomed by Mr. A.
