to Swiss youths during the week.

Father Bossard depicted the advantages of the new Centre. Its many rooms offered possibilities for a variety of activities, including dancing, Bible study and discussion. Sunday Mass was celebrated in the Dance Hall while the German-speaking Protestants held their service in the Conference Room. Father Bossard mentioned the facilities for after-mass supper or tea and said that Sunday evening activities regularly attracted 150 to 250 youths. There was every hope that the rent for the Centre would be met with the entrance fee of 15p per member.

Father Bossard expressed regret at the closure of St. Ann's and the loss of the atmosphere of devotion and recollection which one felt in a sacred building, but expressed gratefulness that an adequate solution should have been found to the Church's accommodation problem.

The closure of St. Ann's had also entailed moving to a new flat. Father Bossard had rejected various proposals to find a lodging in a central London parish that would have hindered his social work in his own Church but thanks to the support of Cardinal Heenan, a flat and an office, now in the course of construction, will be provided for the Chaplain at the John Southworth Centre itself. Since the closure of the St. Ann's premises on 17th February last, Father Bossard had been living temporarily in a neighbouring flat.

Father Bossard ended his report by expressing thanks to Cardinal Heenan, to the Management Committee of the John Southworth Centre and to the Swiss Protestant Churches for their cooperation in helping the Swiss Catholic Church in London to solve its material problems. He also thanked the Embassy, the Committee of the Swiss Lenten Action and the Bishops of Switzerland for their co-operation and specially mentioned Mr. and Mrs. O. Grob.
