## Solidarity Fund of the Swiss abroad



Does everybody really know the Fund?

Does everyone know the exact meaning of the expressions with which he describes his aims?

Has one considered everywhere what possibilities the Fund offers? Here follows a short glossary with whose help everyone can examine his knowledge. Perhaps this is also an opportunity to check one's personal requirements.

## Small Glossarv

Having it both ways

1. savings capital in Swiss francs

2. lump sum compensation on losing basis of livelihood due to political events

Basis of livelihood

not only includes income by the self-employed, but also wages and salaries of the employees and pensions and annuities of any kind.

One does not exclude the other. The person who receives lump sum compensation continues to enjoy the right of having his whole savings capital paid back.

A large part of lump sum compensation paid out during the past few years has gone to employees. When the labour market is disturbed difficulties may arise even on returning to Switzerland.

Wives and children.

whether in employment or not, depend on a personal basis of livelihood. This can be secured independently from husband (or parents).

The same principle applies here as in the OAI which is open to wives (even if they are married to foreigners and even if they are not employed). Their contributions are calculated on the basis of an income which represents the livelihood provided for them by their husbands.

Length of membership is unlimited, i.e. it does not cease on retirement.

This is where the guarantee gains increased importance (apart from savings capital). It safeguards the livelihood of old people: pensions, annuities (always in case of loss due to political events).



## **Short-term insurance** for Sickness and Accidents

Some time ago you were informed in this paper of an agreement regarding sickness insurance in favour of repatriated Swiss, provided they are under 70. Some of you may have felt aggrieved because this agreement only applies if one is resident in Switzerland.

It therefore seemed expedient to us to examine the possibilities of sickness and accident insurance for the Swiss abroad, all the more as insurances abroad do not give the same sort of cover as companies do in Switzerland. Apart from the states which have no social institutions as such, there are also a great many different welfare systems in being. They have only one thing in common: they are operable only in the country in which they were created and thus only in favour of residents in that particular country. Therefore it is not possible for a Swiss abroad to join a Swiss sickness insurance company as long as he is living outside Switzerland, except in very few special cases.

If somebody is on holiday outside the country in which he has permanent residence, his insurance even accidents. But due to often complicated administrative profour insurance companies have introduced a special type of cover, called travel insurance. Following

covers the cost of sickness and cedure, many decide not to claim any refund of expenses incurred. In order to improve this situation,

We have no doubt that many Swiss living abroad will wish to profit from this insurance possibility which enables them to travel without worry.

It is important to remember that the insurance is only valid once the insured is in Switzerland. Due to international agreements, costs incurred on the journey are not covered. It is advisable therefore to cover this risk with an insurance company in your country of residence.

## **Creating toys**

Pierre Küenzi, citizen of Berne, was born in 1945. He went to school in Bienne and later moved to Neuchâtel where he attended courses at the Commercial School. It was during that time that he discovered his passion for manual work, particularly in the field of children's toys. The influence of his sister who was a kindergarten teacher obviously contributed to this development, and in addition he received the necessary support from his parents who showed great understanding of his wishes. Since 1965, he has been involved in this artistic occupation whose beginnings were rather tedious. In order to surmount these initial difficulties, he worked in various fields, and they confirmed his deep vocation: to design children's tovs.

In 1969 he was rewarded for his perseverance by a federal scholarship for applied art. This was awarded to the winners of a competition. He was given the same distinction in 1970 and 1971.

Pierre Küenzi not only creates toys, but he has also explored the behaviour of the child with regard to play. His aim was the social integration of the latter. He began to co-operate hand in hand with children, young handicapped people, parents and teachers. In order to widen his knowledge, he attended courses on therapeutic teaching. He made progress from year to year in all these fields. All the situations facing a child are of interest to him: on the road, in his room, in his relationship with his parents etc. With the acquired impressions he tried to realise an innate wish and a need of a child and of adults in play and toys.

At present, Pierre Küenzi divides his activities between research in the field of the backward child at a large institution in Western Switzerland and the work in his own toy studio.
