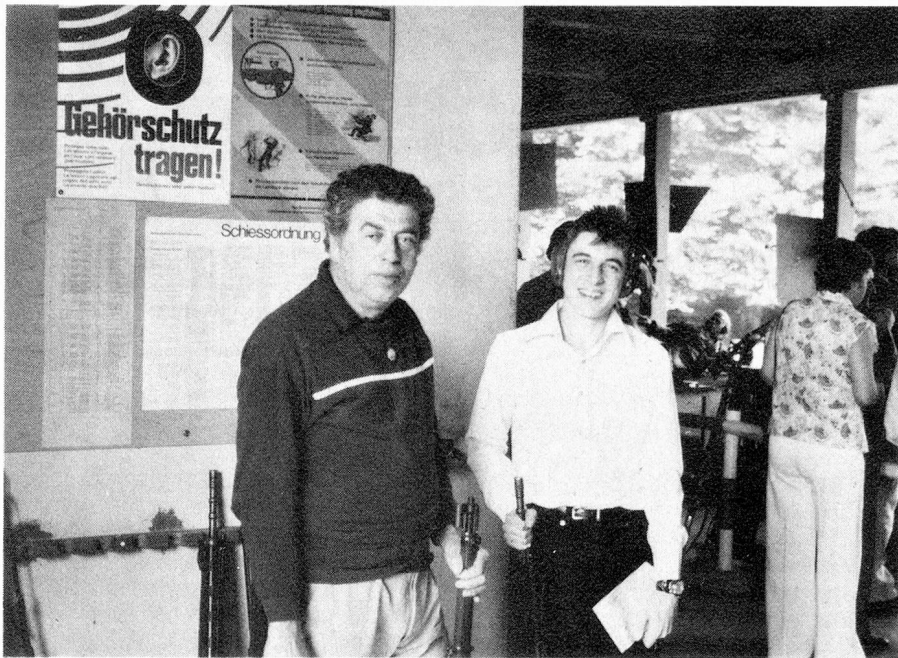

The Swiss writer Etienne Barilier was born in 1947. He was educated in Lausanne, taking a first degree at the local University in 1971 and his doctorate in the spring of 1977. He spent one of the intervening years as assistant at Lausanne University, and three at the Swiss Institute in Rome, where he prepared his doctoral thesis on Albert Camus.
