# SWISS TRADE AND TRANSPORT

Switzerland's foreign trade expressed in weight is divided unequally among the various means of transport used. Thus, in 1977, of the total 31.2 million tonnes of goods imported, 30.8% was brought into Switzerland by road, 25.2% by water, 23.6% by rail, 20.3% by gas pipeline and 0.1% by air.

With regard to exports, which in 1977 totalled 4.3 million tonnes, the picture is quite different, because gas pipelines and water transport play practically no role in outward trade. Once again by weight, 48.7% of all goods exported were transported by road and 47.9% by rail.

Compared with 1976, the importance of road transport increased in 1977 not only for imports but also for exports, while the proportion carried by rail remained constant for imports and fell for exports.
