The above 1st Class only express service will run for the 1988 summer season, between May 29th and October 23rd. 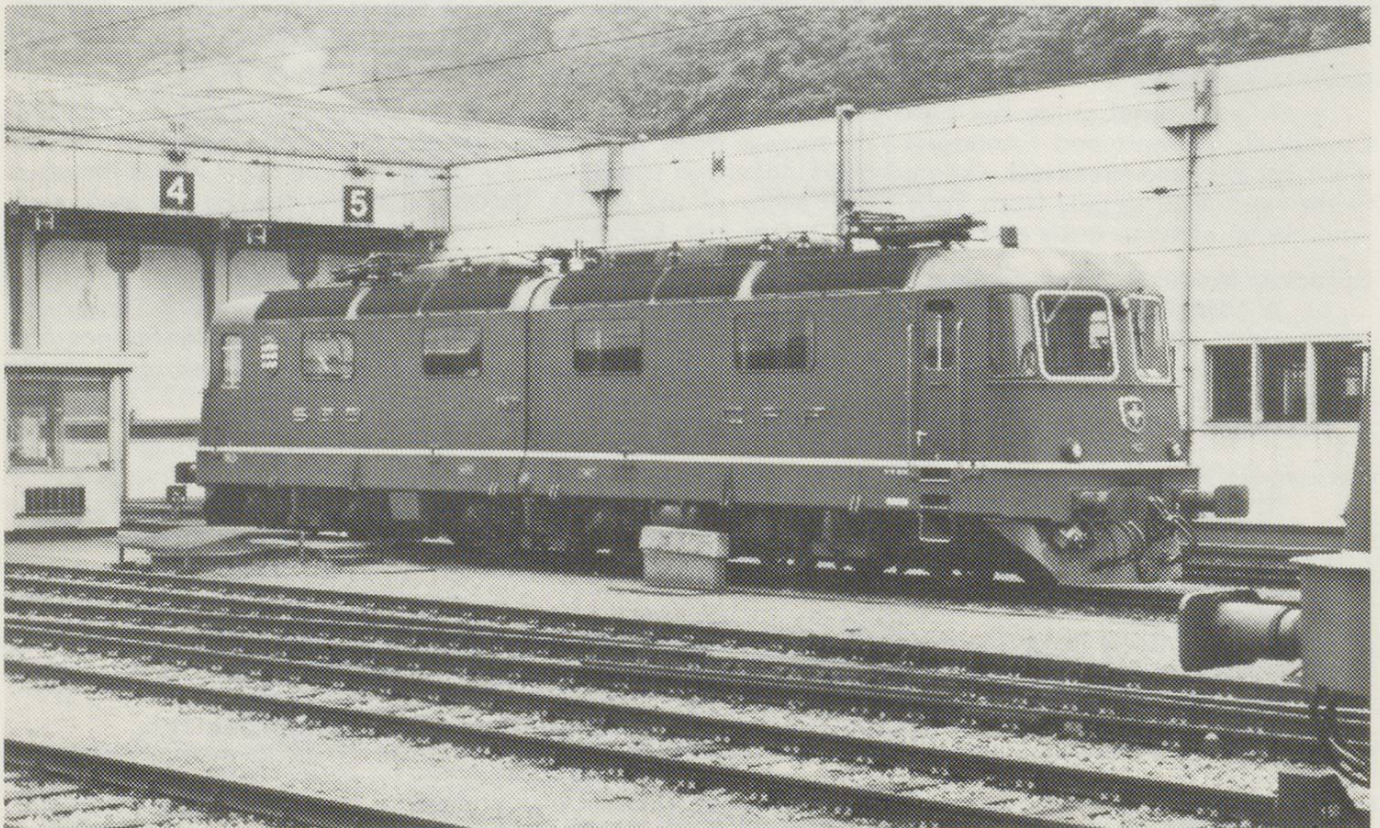
EXPRESS POST
