The 15th Spring Meet by Dave Howsam

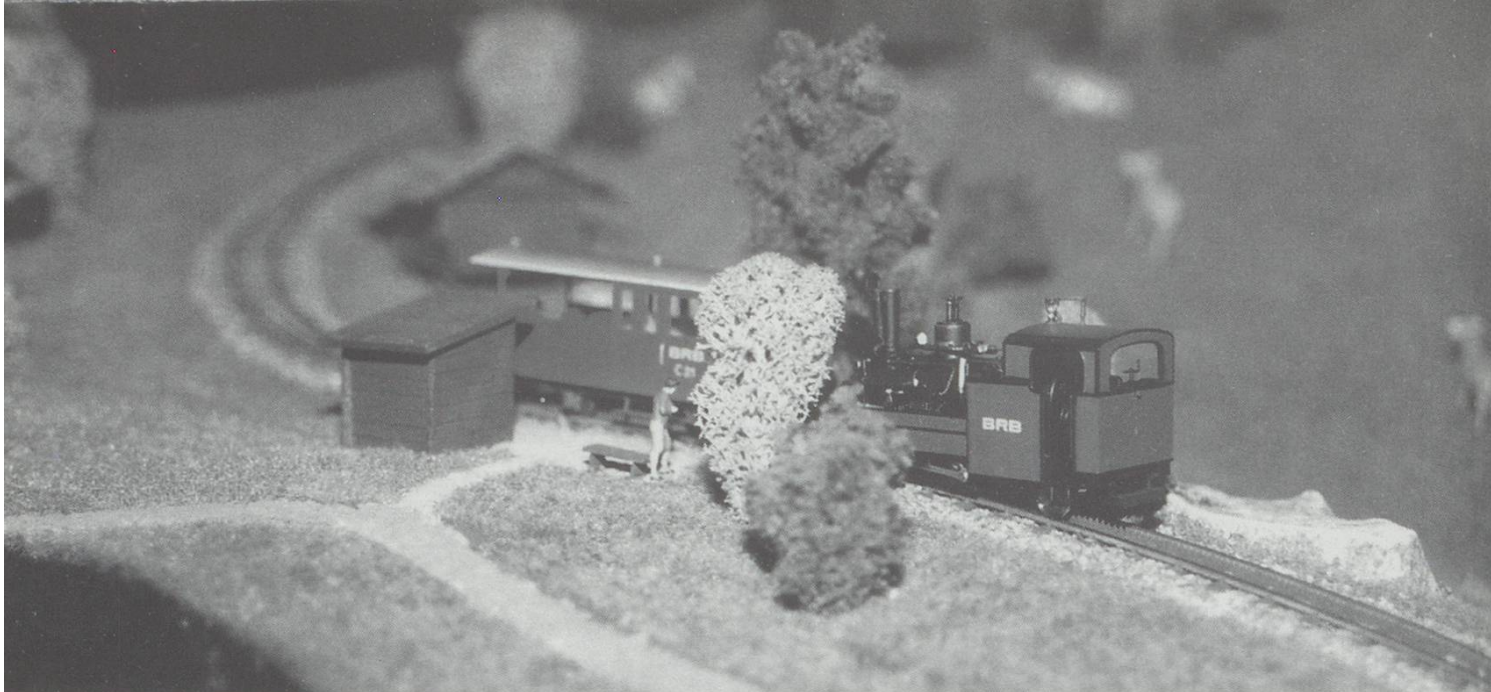

There were plenty of ways of parting with money including well stocked stalls by WINCO, MITV, Great Little Trains, Heath Publishing Services, Simon Smiler Video, Maureen Cooling, SRS Sales and a raffle offering two 8-day first-class Swiss Passes (courtesy of Switzerland Tourism). 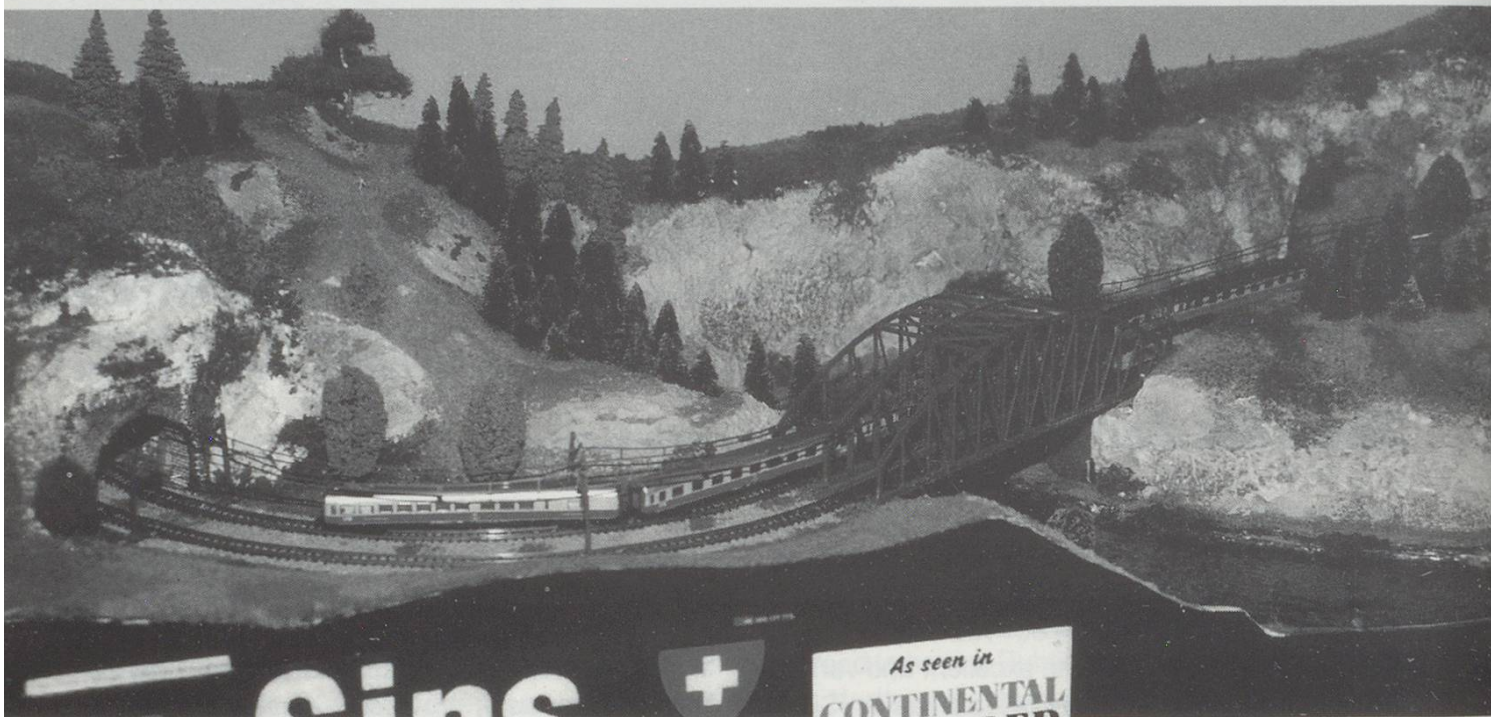
also sold some framed pictures and the newly published book *Switzerland by Rail* (reviewed in the last *Swiss Express*).

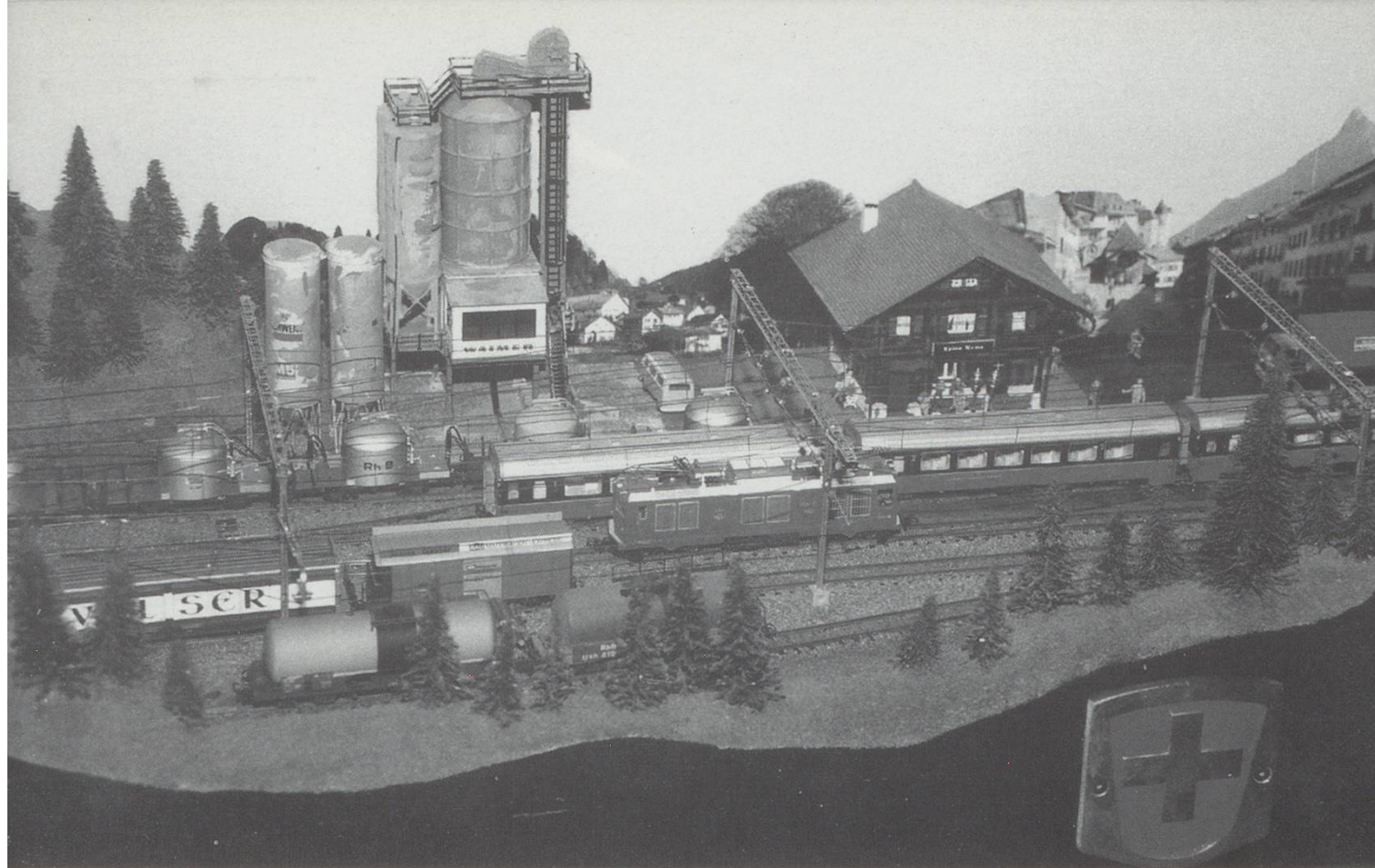

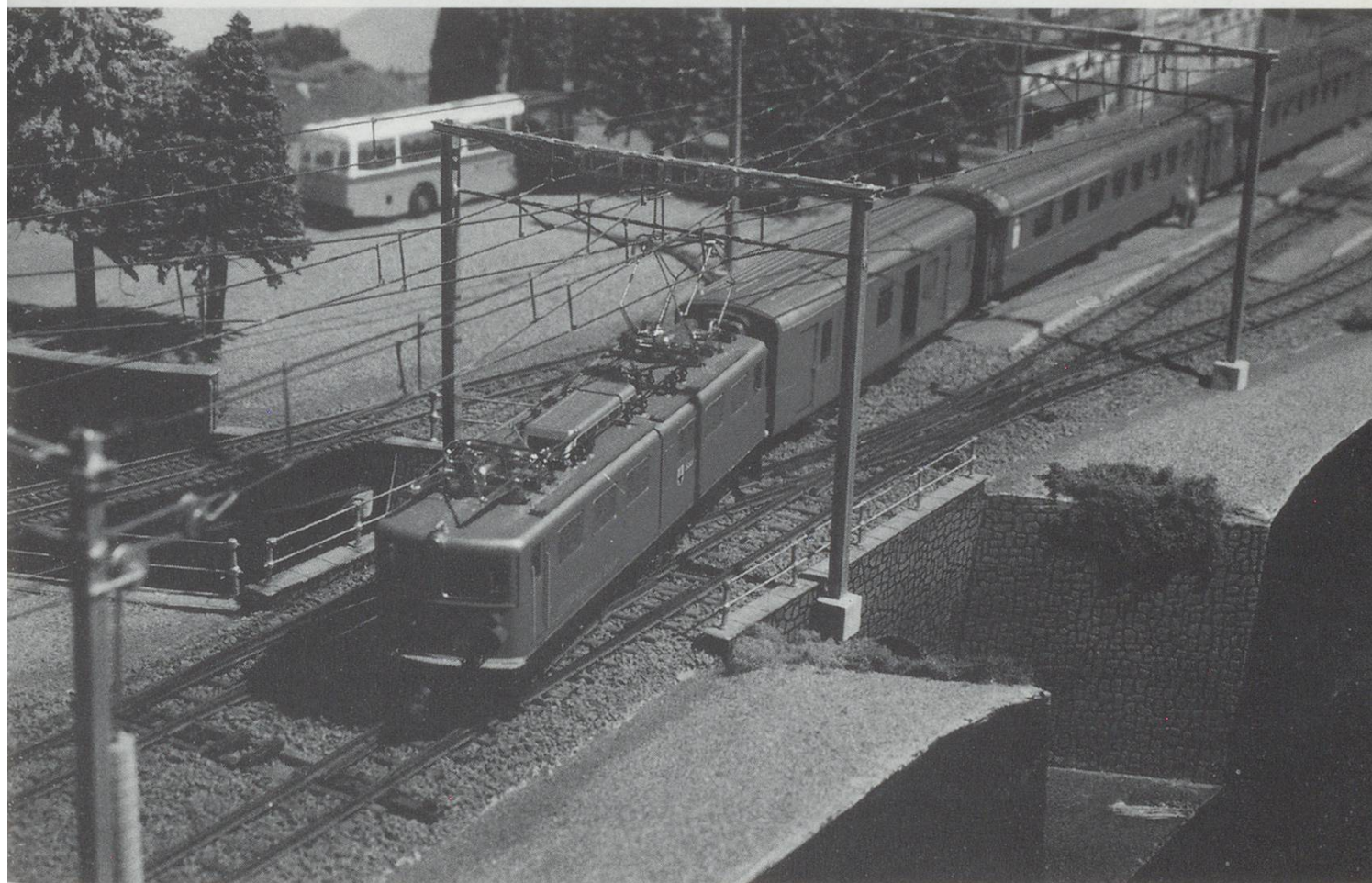

Memmorial Award at the York Exhibition in 1996. (see page 5)

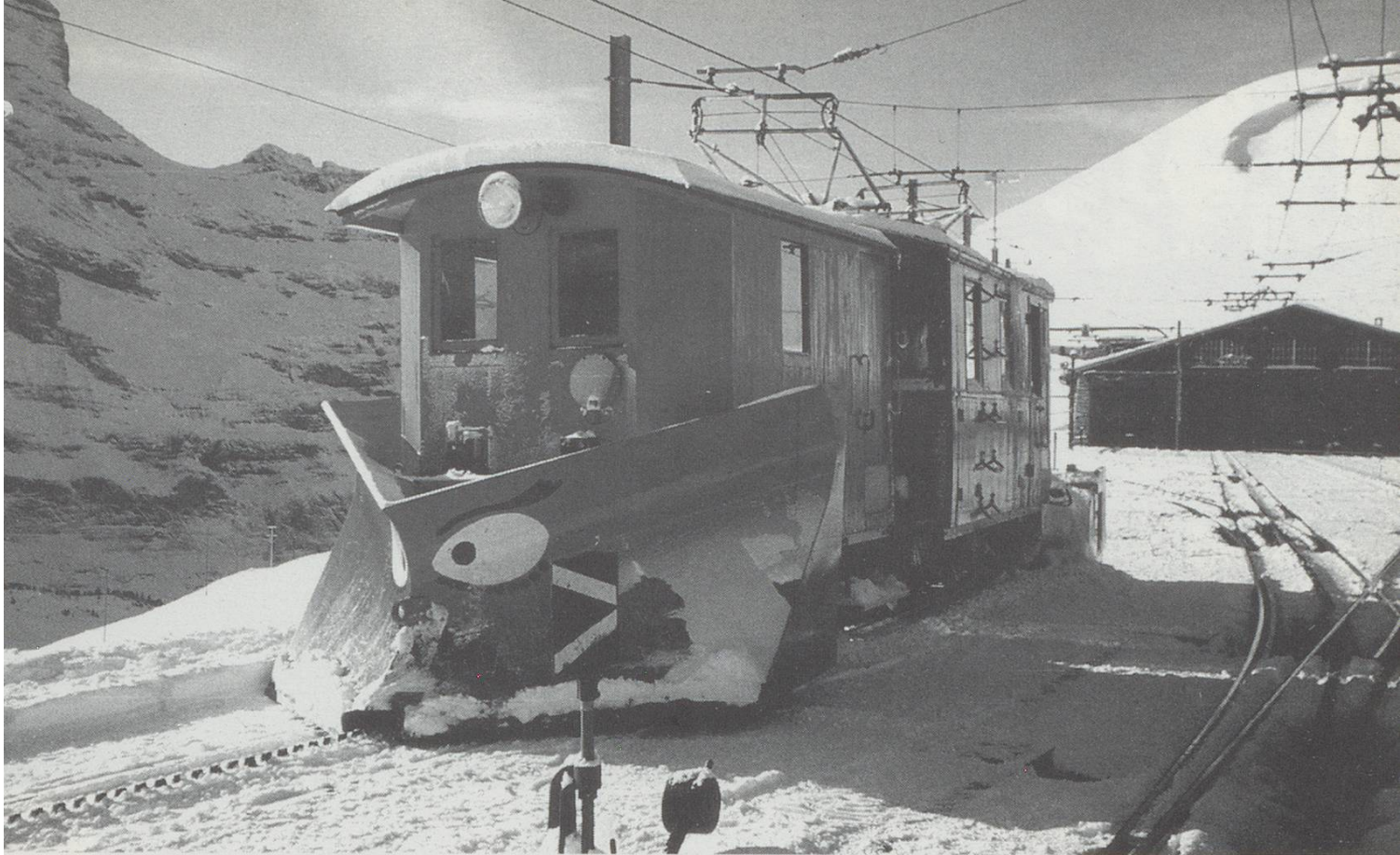
