My love affair with the railways of Switzerland go back to my childhood, which started as a result of holidays abroad travelling by rail from Calais to destinations in Italy. My father worked for British rail at the time and this enabled us to have otherwise unaffordable holidays abroad. My earliest recollection was of waking up in the small hours and peering out the corner of the couchette window blind and seeing brown electrics of the BLS at Brig.

As I went through my teenage years I drifted away from railways until an opportunity to take a last "free spirit" trip around Europe on an Interrail card before leaving University and settling into a career. I still remember clearly the spirals at Wassen on the Gotthard and was so taken with them that I managed to cut myself whilst shaving in the toilet of an FS couchette. This was the first of many visits that were to follow to the Gotthard route, in fact Switzerland in general.

From a modelling prospective, the challenge was to capture and recreate an Alpine main line in N Gauge. Many layouts came and went, some made it to exhibitions and some as far as the local tip!! The latest venture is a 16ft x 8ft model of a part of the Gotthard around "Intchi" on the North Ramp.

So when I'm not visiting Switzerland or building layouts, my work keeps me occupied. I am a Logistics Manager for a European transport company.

I hope that in my post as Exhibitions Officer I will get the opportunity to meet and talk with you at our stand. Do please stop and say hello.
