We have a wide range of books especially related to Swiss railways and it seems a waste of resources that they just sit gathering dust on the shelves of the Library.

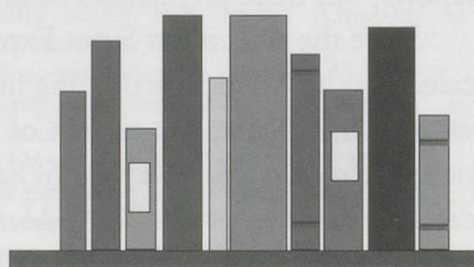

LIBRARY SHELVES - THE SBB LIBRARY - Giles Della Gana

As a result of my appeal in last December's issue of 'Swiss Express' I was sent copies of 'Railway Holiday in Switzerland' and 'Swiss Travel Wonderland' by the archive section of the SBB in Bern. I feel that this is not only a most generous gesture in itself, but shows also that our Society is highly regarded by 'the powers that be'. I am told that 'Swiss Express' is read at the highest levels.



The SBB's library is somewhat larger than ours. It contains some 40,000 books, 1000 periodicals and 600 reports covering technology, economics, social sciences and law from Switzerland and other countries. Recent books and articles have been placed on a database called appropriately 'SWISSBASE'.
