Text can be in any of the main programmes but if you aren't using Word, Office or Works please remember to save it as an RTF, that way Word will be able to open it. Being a Microsoft programme it won't recognise anything but itself or RTF.

Photographs. Unless you have a very good scanner, know how to scan and can save your scans as Tiffs or .psd send prints, negatives or transparencies. We will try to turn them round quickly and send them back. Standard flat bed transparency holders do not scan well enough for print. SRS has purchased a high-end scanner capable of producing file sizes in excess of 100MB, 4000dpi in 48-bit colour. We don't need this very often but when we do we are pleased that it is there. Digital camera images are very welcome. Ideally send them in as Tiffs or RAW images, if you do not have this facility then .jpg is ok. Typically we are looking for file sizes capable of producing 15cmx10cm at 300dpi as a minimum. Even better would be A4 at 300dpi. Resolution is a complex topic and if you are not sure give me a call and I will discuss it with you. Whatever you send in digitally do not alter the digital negative, no sharpening, no level adjustment or resizing. Leave it to us so that it can adjusted to our colour profile.
