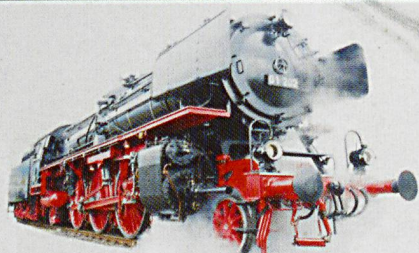

## Steam on the Gotthard

During the spring and summer of 2015 several steam train operations were organised just before the ETCS-II-technology was realised on some parts of the Gotthard route. The first one was a great happening with two steam and one electric powered engine: from 4th March to the 8th March the steam locomotives 01 202 (“Verein Pacific 01 202”) and 01 1066 were on the Gotthard line with a special train with international coaches. Organised by Eisenbahn-Nostalgiefahrten Bebra, the special train was planned to go to Locarno, with a special program in Canton Ticino with locomotives of the Luino railway museum. On the tour back to the north of Switzerland and Germany two engines from Luino escorted the main train. The second steam event was similar to the program in March; this was organised by IGE Erlebnisreisen from 26th June to 30th June. The train travelled from Frankfurt to Basel with steam engine 01 150, then together with Pacific 01 202 to Luzern and from there to Ticino. IGE Erlebnisreisen organised a perfect programme together with other partners (see [www.ige-erlebnisreisen.de](http://www.ige-erlebnisreisen.de)). Ae 6/6 No.11407 and a special train of Museo Ferroviario Luino with Ae 4/7 No. 10987 Italy, (see [www.verbanoexpress.it](http://www.verbanoexpress.it)) was another attraction on these days. The two trains were lead by BR 01 150, 01 202 and 141R1244 ex-SNCF, now operated by Verein Mikado 1244 ([www.mikado1244.ch](http://www.mikado1244.ch)), and BR 50 3673 from the Luino museum. Another steam train was organised on 10th May: B 3/4 No.1367 of SBB-historic was at the head of a beautiful passenger train with coaches from the steam period of Swiss railways. It was a birthday and a wedding day ‘cruise’ from Zürich to Göschenen and back.
