NOMINATIONS FOR DIRECTORS

Directors who hold the following positions on the Board of Directors have completed their three-year term of office and the posts are available for re-election: Chairman, Membership Secretary and Director of Publicity & Exhibitions (3 years in each case).

Please note that the current Chairman and Director of Publicity & Exhibitions will not be seeking re-election so these posts must be filled by other members of the Society.

Job Description summaries for all three posts have been placed in the Members' section of the Society's website and are available by post or e-mail from the Company Secretary. Nominations are invited for all three directorships and nomination forms are available from the Company Secretary:

Completed forms must reach the Secretary no later than Tuesday 31st December 2019. Any applicant who has not previously served on the Society's Board or Committee will be sent a document by the Company Secretary which summarises the basic requirements that have to be met by a Company Director.

Excluding applicants who are seeking to continue their existing SRS directorships, all applicants will be invited by the Company Secretary to attend a Board meeting on 18th January 2020, and will be interviewed by a panel of Board members that day. Subsequently, nominees will be asked to submit a statement to the Company Secretary in support of their application by 28th February.

It is important to note that all nominees AND their proposers and seconders will be expected to have paid their subscriptions for 2020 PRIOR to signing the nomination form. Failure to do so will render the nomination form invalid unless the relevant subscriptions are paid by 28th February. If a potential nominee does not know other Society members who could endorse his/her application, then he/she should contact the Company Secretary who will address the matter.

Members are advised that a list of nominees and a copy of the accompanying statements made to support their nominations, will be supplied by the Company Secretary on receipt of an application by post with an SAE or by email at the above addresses.

Any application for a postal vote must be accompanied by an SAE and will be sent out by post only to the named addressee who must be a member of the Society at the time of application. The application must reach the Company Secretary by Saturday 28th March 2020. Completed ballot papers must reach the Secretary no later than the start of the AGM meeting on Saturday 4th April 2020.

Notice is also hereby given that at the Society's Annual General Meeting on 4th April 2020, paragraph 34.2 of the Memorandum & Articles of Association will be replaced with the following words:

"Nominations for Management Committee posts shall be received by the Secretary by 31st December. Unless the nomination is made by a current Management Committee member seeking to extend his or her term of office in the same role, all nominees will be required to meet representatives of the Management Committee by 31 January, so they have an opportunity to learn more about the post and can discuss their suitability to fulfil the role in question.

"All nominees will be asked to submit a statement in support of their application to the Company Secretary by 28 February, in order that it can be included in the printed brochure for the Annual General Meeting.

All nominations will be considered at the Annual General Meeting but the

Management Committee reserves the right to offer a view on some or all of them where appropriate."

Letter to the Editor

FROM: Bryan Stone - by Email Swiss Rail Centres; Olten Part Two

A small but significant point in Steve Tinsley's article on Olten in the September Swiss Express. Steve implies that the many container trains seen at Olten originate or end in the Basel Rhein port. Actually this is not so; they are just what my reader's letter 9 (in the same issue - Ed) referred to: they are mostly real trans European maritime containers to and from Rotterdam, sometimes Antwerp and Zeebrugge, which are using the EU Corridor Rotterdam – Alps – Northern Italy.

There is also an element of inner-European cargo, as with trainloads of Ambrogio, LKW Walter, etc., using domestic containers and tank containers. And there are the rolling highway piggybacks of HUPAC/BLS, Freiburg im Breisgau – Novara, as shown in a picture.

There is indeed a substantial barge container traffic to Basel, but it is almost all Swiss import/export traffic for overseas. The significance? Here EU and Swiss government pull together with subsidies, but also with line of route improvements, to encourage rail transit throughout, instead of HGVs over the Alps.
