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
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SUMMER PLEASURES

THE VINEGROWERS FESTIVAL

VEVEY - AUGUST 1st TO 14th, 1955

In a natural setting unmatched by any Hollywood creation, Ceres and Bacchus, Pales, Pomona and a hundred and one other Olympian gods and goddesses and household divinities of the fields and woods will soon be mingling with the dancing and singing throngs of their faithful servants, the peasants, vinegrowers, tillers of the soil and reapers... under the admiring eyes of thousands of spectators who have come from the four corners of the earth to see and applaud this festival.

For centuries now, the « Honorable Brotherhood of the Vinegrowers of Vevey » has been celebrating the vine, wine, work in the fields and rustic life to the rhythm of the seasons, with mythological allegories interspersed with choruses and dances. Formerly these festivals were only local celebrations but they gradually grew in size and have become impressive popular festivities attracting big international crowds of discerning tourists.

The last « Vinegrowers Festival » was held in 1927. The next is due to take place at the beginning of



August. For many weeks now, some three thousand performers—actors, dancers, singers and supers—including nine hundred and fifty children, have been learning their parts, practising and rehearsing. Soon they will be appearing in the big arena for the afternoon and evening performances. A procession has already paraded through the streets of the city, proclaiming the coming festival.
