The copying of the creations of Parisian haute couture

As we regularly mention, the models of Parisian Haute Couture reproduced in this periodical are registered models and all rights of reproduction are reserved. In fact, as the couturiers have said : « ...the commercial capital of the fashion houses is constituted by their exclusive rights on their original creations. These rights, which are as rigidly protected in France as authors' copyrights, are materialised in the interest aroused at the showing of the collections and the ensuing world demand. Any premature disclosure of the original creations therefore considerably reduces the commercial value of these rights.»

Now couturiers have always, at one time or another, been the victims of copyists and have always protected their interests by imposing strict checks at the time of the showing of their collections ; this has not however prevented certain leakages.

The world press has recently reported a lawsuit brought against an American firm alleged to be specialising in the copying of fashions, and the Parisian Fashion Designers Joint Committee has issued a statement in this connection, from which we have taken the present information.

The accused firm is alleged to have sold its clients copies of the sketches of the principal Parisian couturiers, bearing the designers' signatures, one month before the date fixed for the authorised release of the collections, that is to say at the very moment of the Paris openings and before the couturiers had even had time to make their own deliveries to their regular clients. This copying had assumed such proportions that, in August 1955, the organisation in question had supplied more than three hundred models by *Christian Dior, Jacques Fath, Jeanne Lanvin-Castillo* and *Jean Patou* to its subscribers. The case brought by these four fashion houses will be heard before the Supreme Court of the State of New York and will be the most important ever known in the annals of fashion. In addition to various other sanctions, the injured parties are suing for damages amounting to more than one million dollars.
